



## "Bare Bones" HTML

Listed below are a FEW of the basic commands you might want to use to spice up your webpage. One of the main things you need to remember about HTML is, in most cases, when you start an HTML command you also need to end it. (Similar to the way the old Appleworks program used to work!) These commands (or tags as they are called by webmasters!) allow you to manipulate text, add images, and create lists and tables, and much more. Most tags are not case sensitive so they could be entered in either all upper or all lower case in your HTML.

### Formatting Tags

<b>Bold</b> -	<code>&lt;b&gt;</code> This tag will bold your text <code>&lt;/b&gt;</code>																
<i>Italics</i> -	<code>&lt;i&gt;</code> This tag will italicize your text <code>&lt;/i &gt;</code>																
<u>Underlined</u> -	<code>&lt;u&gt;</code> This tag will underline your text <code>&lt;/u&gt;</code>																
Heading sizes -	<code>&lt;h1&gt;&lt;/h1&gt;</code> <code>&lt;h2&gt;&lt;/h2&gt;</code> <code>&lt;h3&gt;&lt;/h3&gt;</code> <code>&lt;h4&gt;&lt;/h4&gt;</code> <code>&lt;h5&gt;&lt;/h5&gt;</code> <code>&lt;h6&gt;&lt;/h6&gt;</code> <code>&lt;h1&gt;</code> This font size is biggest! <code>&lt;/h1&gt;</code> <code>&lt;h6&gt;</code> This font size is smallest! <code>&lt;/h6&gt;</code>																
Font sizes -	<code>&lt;font size=#&gt;</code> text goes here <code>&lt;/font&gt;</code>																
Centering -	<code>&lt;center&gt;</code> This text will be centered <code>&lt;/center&gt;</code> (this works for images too!)																
Font Colors -	<code>&lt;font color="#NNNNNN"&gt;&lt;/font&gt;</code> There are tons of font colors out there, here are a few: <table><tr><td><code>#000000</code></td><td>Black</td><td><code>#FFFFFF</code></td><td>White</td></tr><tr><td><code>#FF0000</code></td><td>Red</td><td><code>#00FF00</code></td><td>Green</td></tr><tr><td><code>#0000FF</code></td><td>Blue</td><td><code>#FF00FF</code></td><td>Magenta</td></tr><tr><td><code>#00FFFF</code></td><td>Cyan</td><td><code>#FFFF00</code></td><td>Yellow</td></tr></table>	<code>#000000</code>	Black	<code>#FFFFFF</code>	White	<code>#FF0000</code>	Red	<code>#00FF00</code>	Green	<code>#0000FF</code>	Blue	<code>#FF00FF</code>	Magenta	<code>#00FFFF</code>	Cyan	<code>#FFFF00</code>	Yellow

<code>#00FFFF</code>	Cyan	<code>#FFFF00</code>	Yellow														
Page background	<code>&lt;body bgcolor="#NNNNNN"&gt;</code> Use a color code (see color code sheet!) in place of the N's or find a background on a website and you can use it by replacing the #N's with the background address and name!																

### Lines and Such!

(these tags do not need to be turned off!)

Paragraphs	<p>Use before a new paragraph.
Horizontal Rule	Or in other words a horizontal line! <hr>
Line Break	Use this to start a new line  

### Link Tags

(these tags allow you to link your page to other pages and more!)

Email address	<a href=mailto:your email address">your name</a>
Another page	<a href=http://web address>Web page name</a>

### List Tags

Numbered Lists	<ol> <li>First I tem <li>Second I tem etc..... </ol>
Bulleeted Lists	<ul> <li>First I tem <li>Second I tem etc..... </ul>

### Image Tags

(these tags allow you to add graphics and to manipulate them)

Basic Image	
Image aligned top of the text	
Image aligned middle of text	align=middle>
Image aligned bottom of text	align=bottom>

### Table Tags

(these tags allow you to create a table with as many columns and rows as you need)

<tr>           table row  
<td>           table data (first row, first column)  
<td>           table data (first row, second column)  
<td>           table data (first row, third column)  
</tr>  
<tr>           table row  
<td>           table data (second row, first column)  
<td>           table data (second row, second column)  
<td>           table data (second row, third column)  
</tr>  
etc.....  
</table>
```
